Parking Lot Safety

Our greatest interest is OUR students' safety. Your help is needed in this matter. Please help us maintain a safe environment before and after school when dropping off and picking up your children. Here are ways you can contribute to make our parking lot safer.

- Kindergarten pick up ONLY are permitted to use the parking lot adjacent to the kindergarten rooms at 7:50 & 2:20 times. 1st grade late drop off (8:50) and early pick up (1:20) may use this lot at times indicated.
- 2. Grade 1-6 parents only use the big parking lot adjacent to Kid's Junction.
- 3. First Graders: Crossing for Early/Late Readers is available at 8:40 a.m. in the Kindergarten lot only.
- 4. Never leave your car unattended in yellow or red zones.
- 5. BE PATIENT! Please do not cut in front of, or cut off other cars. We are all here for same reason and have somewhere to go.
- Do not get angry with us when we must remind some of you about the ways we are keeping OUR students safe. We don't want to remind you as much as you don't want us to. ^(C)

SUGGESTION – Parents of older students park on the street and have your student meet you there. There would be less congestion in our lots and allow you to get on your way as well.

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

GATE Fall Testing

The Rocklin Unified School District will be conducting testing for the identification of Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) students at Valley View for grades 2 -6 on September 27th. (Students in Grade One will be tested in the spring). To access the "Parent Request Form" for your child to be GATE tested, you may pick one up at our School's front office or download it from the RUSD Website at www.rocklin.k12.ca.us (form is called "Request for Student to be Tested for GATE" under the Curriculum and Assessment Tab/GATE). Please return the form to the District Office, attention Jordan White, no later that September 14. Once students have been tested, parents will be notified of the results, by mail, approx 10-12 weeks after the GATE evaluations are completed.
