8 RULES OF INTERNET SAFETY

- 1. <u>Never</u> give out personal information without your parents' permission!
 - NAMES
 - ADDRESS
 - PHONE NUMBER
 - SCHOOL LOCATION
 - SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER
- 2. <u>Never</u> meet an online stranger offline without your parents' permission!
 - If you are chatting online with someone you don't know, it could be someone pretending to be someone else.
 - If you do want to meet someone that you have met online, make sure it is in a public place and you bring along a parent.
- 3. <u>Never</u> send a picture to someone you don't know or post an inappropriate picture.
- 4. Talk to your parents about messages that are not nice or make you feel uncomfortable.
 - It is not your fault if you receive a message that makes you feel uncomfortable but always tell a parent or trusted adult so they can contact the internet provider and the police dept.
- 5. Follow the rules that your parents have set for online usage.
 - Times of day to use the internet and for how long.
 - Discuss what the appropriate websites are to visit.
- 6. Never use your real name online.
- 7. Never give your password to anyone other than your parents, not even your best friend.
- 8. Be a good online citizen. <u>Don't do anything that hurts someone or is against the law.</u>
